There are loads of other great events too, these are just my favorites. There are 3 easy ways to find out about upcoming events;


- 1. Go to the QCBC website and click on the calendar tab up the top. This shows you all the events as well as any event taking place at QCBC.

Don't fall in love with your hand!!

I remember Robyn Clark explaining to me, on countless occasions, "you have fallen in love with your hand again Stephen", as I overbid another hand. Well old habits die hard and I did it again on the last board of the club champs.

I was sitting North, Louise was South and we were playing Carol Findlay and Maxine Collins



The bidding began with a pass from west, I bid 1H and east passed. South now had a choice of 3 bids depending on your level of experience and how many gadgets you play. Option 1 is to bid 4H, you have a fit in hearts so you add 5 points for your void to your 9HCPs giving you 14TPs which is enough to bid game. Option 2 is to bid 2NT, this is Jacoby 2NT. This shows 4 card support and a hand good enough to make game. And option 3 is bidding 4D. This is a splinter bid which shows 4 card support, a shortage in diamonds, 1 or 0, and 13 to 15 TPs.

Option 1 makes it difficult to know whether partner has a good hand or a weak hand with 5+ hearts. So, generally the bidding will stop at 4H, very good on this particular hand.

Option 2 is a better bid. It tells partner you have a hand good enough for game and gives partner room to describe their hand further to see if slam is possible. The responses to 2NT are 3 of a suit showing shortage, 0 or 1, and 4 of a suit showing 5 cards in that suit too. You can also show how strong you are using 4H, 3NT and 3H showing increasingly stronger hands.


Option 3 is the best bid of all. It describes souths hand perfectly. North then has to decide whether their hand improves or gets worse knowing that south is short in diamonds. You do not want HCPs opposite a shortage, so in this case it is bad news and North should bid 4H.

Louise went with option 2, bidding 2NT, perfectly reasonable. Now this is where I needed to remember Robyn's words of wisdom. Instead, I went wow I have a 20 TP hand and partner has just told me they have a 12+TP hand, sounds like slam time to me.

What I needed to find out from partner was whether they had either Ace of spades or hearts, but I could not work out how to do this, so decided to hope for the best and bid 6H.

A better bid would have been 3C, showing shortage in clubs and then when partner bids 4H stopping.

But I was in love with my hand, there was no stopping me. The fact we were missing 2 aces and Carol & Maxine found their spade ruff, meant down 2 for another bottom!!!!! When will I ever learn.......?
