QCBC have bought a number of new books recently. I have been lucky enough to read a couple of them, here are my thoughts.


Do you get your car serviced on a regular basis? Most people do, to make sure that it is running smoothly and there are no problems. Well, the latest book by **Barbara Seagram, Barbara's Bridge Tips** is like putting your bridge game in for a service. By reading this book you get to realise all the things you don't know or thought you knew. As with all her books, it is easy to read and packed full of great tips. The book is split into three parts, bidding, declarer play and defence. At the end of each part there is a quiz to see if you have taken the tips on board. I highly recommend this book to all Novice players.

"Learn from the mistakes of others, you can never live long enough to make them all yourself." Wise words from Groucho Marx. The next book **Winning at the Club by Matthew Thomson** goes through over 100 boards that club players made mistakes on. It is fascinating to see the common errors club players make, and even more interesting to see how many you would have made!!! Matthew goes through the boards in detail explaining the key issues and the thought process you should have adopted. The boards are in date order, but there is a thematic index at the back, which is very useful. What did I learn? Quite a few

things, but I won't spoil it for you. I enjoyed this book and would recommend it to Novice players that had been playing for a few years.


Warning, what you are about to see should never be tried at a bridge table!!!!!

As my partner and I improve, we have been getting fewer bottom boards than we used to. So, I took it upon myself to invent some new ways to get a bottom.



Louise and I were sitting North South, playing against Deanne Gaskill and Oliver Goodman. All straight forward to start with, I opened 1NT and Deanne bid 2C. I asked what that meant and was told it was natural. Louise bid 2H, which is a transfer to spades. Now I forgot that we play system on where possible, so took it as a natural bid. I thought Louise had 10+ points and 5+ hearts. So, after pass from Oliver, I jumped to 3NT. I was then asked what the heart bid meant and said natural. Oliver then doubled and all passes. When dummy came down, Oliver called the director. Richard Fox asked me what our system was over interference, eventually I remembered. I had transgressed and broken Law No 20 regarding Explanation of Calls. As luck would have it, we got such a bad score that no additional penalty was needed. The lesson for me is to know your system really well, sorry partner.

Not content with that blunder, I managed to crank up the stupidity on this next board. My poor partner Louise and I were sitting East West this time.



So again, all starts normally, North opens 1NT, Louise passes and South bids 2C. They must have played garbage Stayman. So, I remembered that we play system on over interference and bid 2H transfer to spades. Can you see the problem here? Unfortunately, it was not partner who had opened 1NT, it was the opponents!!!!! Should have gone to Specsavers!!! Well North and South couldn't pass fast enough and poor old partner thought we had a 9 card fit. 3 off for another bottom. "Experience is the name we give our mistakes" Oscar Wilde. Well, the way I am going I will be very experienced soon. Here's to gaining loads of experience.
